Speaker at our next meeting

CAROLINE MASON - a quilter from Matamata. Caroline was the lady who organised sending 741 quilts to Vanuatu (we contributed from community quilts if you remember) after cyclone Pam.

Caroline has now started an organisation called **Threads Across the Pacific** – this offers unemployed women of Vanuatu electric sewing machines, sewing supplies and introductory sewing workshops. The Project provides the opportunity, it is up to the individual women whether they use the machines to sew for themselves and their families or whether they choose to produce products to sell, either within their community or to tourists and expats. The secondary purpose is to identify any NiVan woman (from introductory workshop) who has the sewing skills, organisational skills and motivation to progress to offer opportunity and mentoring as tutors.

Caroline and her tutor team take new donated sewing machines and sewing supplies to girls and women in Vanuatu on regular workshop trips. Caroline says her current stocks of cotton fabric and threads are low and she would love to receive these items, especially larger pieces of cotton fabric, lace, zips, patterns etc.

Every woman and school girl receives a basic sewing kit, so if any members would like to contribute towards sewing kits that would be greatly appreciated.

A sewing kit comprises: a drawstring bag containing pins, a pin cushion, a black thread and white thread, hand sewing needles, a tape measure, a notebook and pencil, a small bag of buttons and a pair of fabric cutting scissors.

It would be lovely if our Guild members could each make a sewing kit up for Caroline to take with her after the meeting.

Festival of Quilts Guild Member's Sales table

During Festival of Quilts the Quilt Guild operates a Sales Table where Members items can be sold on your behalf. These could be quilt tops, finished quilts, toys & other patchwork or embellished items. The Guild takes no commission on goods sold.

We ask that all items be clean and in good condition. If your item is a UFO with extra fabric or pattern attached, these are to be put in a clear plastic bag & labeled. Customers are often very interested in these to finish off themselves. This year we ask that you enter the type of quilt rather than size. E.g. King, Queen, Double, Single, Cot, Wall hanging etc. This makes it so much easier for the ladies selling the items.

Members will be able to submit a maximum of 8 items each. There will be a surcharge of \$2 per item to cover expenses. Non refundable. Any surplus funds from this sales fee will be given to Community Quilts.

sharing of knowledge. That's what it's all about.



Community Quilts

Hi everyone

Did you enjoy Alison Lawrence's speech and her art quilts? She has introduced us to a different world of art quilt making. We belong to the same group that meets every Wednesday, Alison's ideas have always been so different and outstanding.

The photos show Val Williams' cot quilt for Community Quilts, an authentic Boro sashiko jacket I saw at Hamilton Craft Show (I was smiling to myself as the tag said it's not for sale!) and my sample that I started to make at an hour class there.

'Boro' means worn out fabric rather than old fabric in Japanese. Poor farmers used to wear them 300 years ago. Nowadays I thought no one wears "Boro" clothes, funny how things change! I may be looking for 'Boro' fabrics when I visit my relatives in Japan next time! I'm sure that they'd have thrown them away years ago.

I am hoping that we can present our children's quilts to Wilson Home in Takapuna at the 'October' meeting. I trust that everyone in Auckland will know Wilson's Home as they would have been operating for over 50 years. I'm not sure at this stage if Carol White, Trust Manager or her representative can come to the meeting, otherwise it will be done at the December meeting together with our yearly presentation to City Mission. If you have toddlers and children's quilts finished, new or old, we'd love to have them!

We gave a cot quilt to a teenage mum by one of our members and 21 quilts were given to Glenburn Psycho Geriatric & Dementia Care in New Lynn in September. I'm so sorry that we didn't have anyone from Glenburn Hospital management to come and collect our quilts. You can appreciate that these hospitals are pretty low key.







Community Quilts will have a large space next to the Members' sale items at Auckland Festival of Quilts again this year. We will have our working bees sewing during the show, so please come and chat with us. We will have a queen bed quilt which Melissa has quilted for our raffle to raise funds for batting as we use a lot every year.

Hi everyone.

It all happens this month...

Eight boxes of sewing stuff are stacked in my new quilting office! I need a storage cupboard to be built into the room, so until then, everything remains in boxes. So I'm trying to finish my KIDS! Challenge quilt — it may be my only entry this year- and can't find my square ruler to cut my 15" square. I will just have to be resourceful.

I wanted to say how much I loved hearing Alison Lawrence speak about her quilts and the exhibitions she enters. Her participation in the SAQA challenges and competitions has driven the genesis of some of her quilts and I found it so interesting to hear her talk about how she chooses her subjects and some of the techniques she uses to create effects. Thanks Alison and please talk to us again sometime.

How to prepare your quilts for FOQ.

The hardworking committee and I are gearing up for Hand In day at the end of this month — still September but pretending to be October. On the day, quilts will be checked first then we will write you a receipt for each quilt. Please keep these as you will need them again to pick up your quilt. If you are not picking up your quilt, please give the receipt to the collector.

What you need to do prior to Hand in Day:

Remember to accurately measure your quilt in cms.

Complete an entry form for each quilt.

Check the Velcro required – soft for quilts – hooks for Challenges.

Put a label on the back left hand corner including quilt title, maker's name, contact number, AQGI membership number, category entered, design source, dimensions in cm (width x length).

Velcro:— Calico is fine, or an unused block from the front — write on it in laundry pen or permanent marker. Hand stitch the label on.

Remove all stray threads and get all pet hairs off the quilt.

If you are selling any quilts or quilt tops at the FOQ, please complete a form (printed in previous newsletter) listing each item. Justine and the ladies will take it from you on Hand in Day.

Wear your current membership badge to Hand In day so we can check current membership.

Judges for FOQ 2017

I'm delighted to announce the three judges for the show – Lisa Call and KJ Dillon from Wellington, and Robyn Burgess from Auckland. Lisa is a contemporary textile artist who divides her time between the United States and New Zealand. Her art quilts have received many awards and featured in numerous publications. K-J Dillon is a quilt designer and maker with more than 20 years' experience across a broad range of quilting styles and disciplines. She has been recognised for her innovative use of colour & precision handapplique. K-J trained has trained internationally with leading appliqué artists including Elly Sienkiewicz, Sharon Schamber and Rita Verrocca. K-J has a love of colour and form. Her current works-in-progress reflect her eclectic tastes & include a contemporary machine-pieced single colour quilt, an original tivaevae collaboration with a French Polynesian artist, and a Jacobean hand-applique quilt that she has been working on since 2001. There are actually more 'current' works-in-progress than that but that's all she's prepared to own up to publicly.

Robyn's shop is Patchwork Passion in Onehunga and she has supported the FOQ for many years as a merchant. Robyn is an accomplished quilter and may be known for her love of hand work, modern quilts, and Japanese fabrics. Robyn is busy once again this year with the children of Redoubt North school spreading the love of quilting to smaller people.

Computer/Hand Guided Quilting

The committee want to clarify what prize category will apply if a quilt contains both hand guided and computer guided quilting. That quilt will be entered in the Computer Guided category. Only completely Hand Guided quilts are able to be entered in the Hand Guided Category.

Mixed Media Criteria

Let's remember, as you make your objects, what criteria the judges are given:

- 1. Some stitching
- 2. At least 2 layers
- 3. It must fit inside a 75cm cube
- 4. Weigh 3kg or less
- 5. May be 3-dimensional and does not have to be hung but must be able to be self-supporting
- 6. If it is hung, HOOK Velcro must be SECURELY attached.
- 7. No clothing items
- 8. It must include a recognisable amount of at least one non-fabric material in its design and execution. Material can include wood, paper, metal, plastics, glass, clay and organic materials such as flax and string. Use of these materials must be an integral part of the design and not just used as an embellishment. If your object does not conform to these criteria, then the judges will not be able to award it a prize.

Modern Quilts Category

This year we will be having a Modern Quilt category with 3 prizes, in the Open Category. For your info, and to be able to give a criteria to the judges, the following definition from the Modern Quilt Guild will apply to what is a modern quilt: What is Modern Quilting?

Modern quilts are primarily functional and inspired by modern design. Modern quilters work in different styles and define modern quilting in different ways, but several characteristics often appear which may

help identify a modern quilt. These include, but are not limited to: the use of bold colours and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid colour, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive negative space, and alternate grid work. "Modern traditionalism" or the updating of classic quilt designs is also often seen in modern quilting.

Please think about entering a quilt in this category – we would love to have a great display of different patterns, colours and quilting so the Festival of Quilts Show will appeal to all ages and stages...

Quilts at Symposium that you want to enter in FOQ

Congratulations to Robyn Croft for her quilt being accepted into Symposium. I'm sure there are many more of you in the guild. We would really like to have your quilts in FOQ. If your quilt is at Symposium on Hand In Day, this is what you need to do:

- 1. Please complete the FOQ 2017 entry form (available on the website or from the newsletters). Scan and email the form with one or two photos of the quilt to me, Debbie Jones at jones@jonesfamily.net.nz. (No photos, no valid entry I won't be chasing photos...)
- 3. Online forms must be received by 30 September 2017, the Hand in day for quilts.
- 4. Please ensure your quilt has the right Velcro backing for Festival of Quilts soft loops for quilts, hooks for challenges.
- 5. Courier or deliver your quilt to me (34A Saltburn Road, Milford I'm so excited by that!)) to arrive by Monday 31 October 2017. Alternatively, quilts may be dropped off at the Auckland Netball Stadium on Wednesday 1 November between 8am and 10am.

Conditions of Entry

(Please read carefully)

General Conditions:

- Entrants both the maker and the quilter must be current financial members of AQGI as at July 15 2017
- Entries must not have been exhibited at any previous AFQ or Dorothy Collard Exhibition
- Entries must have been completed since the last AFQ Show
- Insurance is the responsibility of the owner
- Commission is not applicable on quilt sales
- Judges reserve the right to withhold the presentation of an award if they see fit
- Participation in the exhibition implies acceptance of all conditions

Quilt Entries:

- One entry form must be completed per item
- Quilt dimensions must be accurately recorded in centimetres
- Consent to use images of the quilt for publicity purposes is at the discretion of the quiltmaker preference to be recorded on entry form
- Design sources or patterns must be acknowledged
- For quilts entered in the 'one maker' category, the entire work must be completed by a sole maker this includes all aspects of the work, including piecing, quilting and binding
- Quilts should be entered into the 'Exhibition Only' section if they are not to be judged
- Junior Members must enter their work into the 'Junior' section

Number of Entries:

- A maximum of 6 quilts can be entered by any one quilter, with a maximum of 3 in any category.
- One of the 6 entries may be an oversized quilt. If more than 12 oversized quilts are entered overall, the AFQ Committee reserves the right to run a ballot to determine which quilts will be hung (we are limited to 12 large frames)
- The AFQ Committee reserves the right to move quilts to a different category and/or reduce the number of quilts allowed per quilter, depending on entries received overall

Labels:

- A label must be attached to the back of each quilt, on the bottom left corner when the quilt is viewed from the back, OR if the work is not a quilt, the label may be sewn or pinned in an appropriate position
- The label must contain the following details:
 - o quilt title
 - o maker's name
 - o contact number
 - o AQGI membership number
 - o category entered
 - o design source
 - o dimensions in cm (width x length)

Velcro:

- Velcro must be securely SEWN along the top of the quilt back or onto the top of a hanging sleeve attached to the top of the quilt back - the velcro must NOT be pinned or glued
- Challenge and mixed media quilts must have the HOOK velcro these works are displayed on the solid grey stands
- All other quilts must have the FLUFFY Velcro these works are hung on standard quilt frames
- Quilts that don't comply with the above rules will not be accepted

Definitions:

A Professional quilter is one who:

- has previously been awarded more than one blue ribbon (1st prize) or Best of Show in any judged quilt shows, national or international – number of blue ribbons is accumulative
- teaches or publishes in the field of quilting
- sells, designs, quilts or participates in making quilts for financial gain

Quilt Sizes and Categories for Entry

Quilt Sizes are defined as:

Quilt Size	Width	Length
Wall	0 to 150cm	0 to 150cm
Small	0 to 185cm	0 to 250cm
Large	185cm to 250cm	0 to 250cm

An **Oversized** quilt is larger than a large quilt but NOT exceeding 290 cm in any direction. Only 12 oversized quilts can be accepted over the whole exhibition, regardless of category. **Quilts larger than 290 cm** in any direction will not be accepted.

A maximum of **SIX** quilts may be entered by any one quilter, with a maximum of **THREE** in any one category. Only **ONE** of the six entries may be oversized.
