We will be hiring a bus to chauffeur guild members around the circuit so keep your eye out for the announcements.

We have been fortunate to be able to host a Pam Holland lecture in February, funded by proceeds from the Palmerston North Symposium. There will be more on this on page 6. Make sure to keep this date free, Pam is an amazing textile artist with a wonderful story to tell. It is an honour to have her with us.

# Community Quilts

A happy New Year to you all. It's the year of the Dog in the Chinese zodiac.

I trust that you are enjoying hot summer days at home or while on holiday whether here or overseas. It's a lovely time to be with your family and friends.

We gave 31 quilts each to Auckland City Mission, Anglican Trust for Women & Children, Wilson Home and Salvation Army at the December meeting. I trust that over 90 quilts were delivered on the day! And our sincere appreciation goes to everyone involved in the making of the quilts. I believe that we only have one big bag of finished tops left in our storage instead of three. We will try to organize tying quilts as we did last year when we can. Below please read letters of appreciation for these quilts.

We were given a large carton of fabrics through Justine Jones' contact. These are a half metre or more than a metre in size and we hope to sew these together for backing fabrics for single size beds. Please come and see me at the next meeting. I will have a table for this project.

Lastly I would like to inform you that we gave **157 quilts in 2015, 234 in 2016 and 288 in 2017**. So we have to aim for 300 in 2018? We raised over \$300.00 from the raffle sale of two quilts and \$1,000.00 was donated by Justine Jones' sales table for members.

I understand her best selling items were fat quarter fabrics. Our green large raffle quilt was won by Marian Platt from Whangarei and a black applique was won by Bobbie Parsons.

The ATWC is approximately 120 years old and has provided services and care for disadvantaged and at risk families during that time and now also provides parenting programs and also councilors in some schools. They collect clothing, furniture and food for vulnerable families as well, and Mothers Union has helped and supported them throughout this time.*

Thank you for another wonderful donation of beautiful handmade quilts and Christmas stockings to the Auckland City Mission. I have included a photo of May, one of our clients in her new home with the beautiful quilt you donated.


Your ongoing support and generosity also makes it possible for the City Mission to continue helping hundreds of Auckland families, like Anthony's who have nowhere else to turn when they are in desperate need.

Last Christmas, Anthony and his family were going through a tough time. Anthony's wife was ill and Anthony unexpectedly lost his job and had trouble finding another. Faced with not being able to provide a Christmas for their two children, Anthony made the brave decision to come to the Mission and ask for our help. We helped with an emergency food parcel, assistance to obtain financial support, and presents for their children. As Anthony explained at the time, "It has been a really stressful few months for our family, but everybody at the Mission has been so supportive."

Throughout this holiday period and in the coming year, the Mission will distribute thousands of emergency food parcels and gifts to families facing real hardship. 2,000 guests will share our Christmas Day community lunch. Mission staff will also continue to provide low-cost healthcare, alcohol and drug detoxification services, support for the homeless, emergency food parcels, and advocacy to Aucklanders living in desperate need.

Thank you, once again for your support of the Auckland City Mission. I would like to wish you all a wonderful Christmas and New Year.


## **Wonderfil Specialty Threads will be the merchant at the February meeting.**

# Challenges

Hi everyone – I hope you all have had a safe and enjoyable break. I have spent some time working on my entry for the Dorothy Collard challenge, hopefully you have as well!

Don't panic if you haven't – there's still time. Hand in Day is at the March Meeting.

The exhibition will be at the Lake House Arts Centre; 37 Fred Thomas Drive Takapuna from the 9 April to 29 April and will be shown again at the Festival of Quilts in November.

Please use the entry form on the next page.

Here is a reminder of the rules:

- Must feature a flying geese block somewhere on the quilt. Subject is up to you
- Must contain 3 layers and be quilted
- Size: 20" by 30" (landscape format)
- Label – must contain Name, membership number, Title of the Quilt and a phone number
- Must have a hanging sleeve

This year the Lake House have a new hanging system and we are no longer allowed to pin our quilts on the walls. There needs to be a hanging sleeve sewn onto the back of your quilt, it would also be helpful if you could sew a Hook Velcro strip on the hanging sleeve so that we can easily display at the Festival of Quilts in November.

Lake House Arts Centre are also keen to have small items available for sale; ie cushions, small wall hangings and bags etc... Their normal commission of 30% will apply.
